BUILDING BEYOND

Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen.

Ephesians 3:20-21



This passage from St. Paul's letter to the Ephesians has always spoken to me. It reminds me that God, in Christ Jesus, can take our generous gifts and accomplish more than we can ask or imagine. It reminds me that God is always BUILDING BEYOND what I have in mind.

BUILDING BEYOND is the theme of this year's generosity emphasis. For the first time in 10 years, the intent of this effort is twofold: We intend to raise *capital funds* for

building repair and strategic mission growth; and at the same time, we intend to fully support our ongoing ministry (*annual operating fund*) in 2025.

Over the next two months, you'll learn more about BUILDING BEYOND. With a total capital goal of \$1,285,375 given between now and the end of 2027 and a total annual goal of approximately \$750,000 to support ongoing ministry in 2025, there is a lot to do...and a lot to celebrate. Thanks be to God for our healthy needs (healthy mission and ministry require resources) and our exciting opportunities!

Here's a snapshot of what's included in the capital portion of BUILDING BEYOND:

- 1. To maintain a place where all can be known and loved. This is the BUILDING portion of BUILDING BEYOND. Plans include a new roof and fascia, repaired drywall and insulation, and a resealed parking lot. Minor upgrades include a refreshed narthex and optimizing acoustics in the sanctuary.
- To support our strategic vision of being (and being known as) a community that is welcoming, healing, and supportive for all. We hope to BUILD BEYOND our current capabilities in communication, mental health– related ministries, youth engagement and empowerment, and staffing and succession planning.
- 3. To continue CtK's outward-focused mission of loving and serving the world. As the deliberate missional component of BUILDING BEYOND, we will extend the lifespan of the Mission Fund. Any CtK person actively volunteering at a local nonprofit may apply for special project funds up to \$5,000.
- 4. To support CtK's mission for many years to come. This is the legacy portion of BUILDING BEYOND. We will establish a Building Fund for future emergency building maintenance and repair as well as make a healthy contribution to CtK's Endowment Fund.

"Welcome to CtK" Luncheon Sunday, October 6


