CAN ANYTHING GOOD COME OUT OF LEVITICUS?



If you've ever read the biblical book of Leviticus, congratulations. It's a tough read. There are a lot of laws, measurements, detailed descriptions, and ancient customs that aren't applicable to life in the 21st century.

The 25th chapter, however, contains something that caught my attention. The italicized heading in my HarperCollins Study Bible says "The Sabbatical Year." The next seven verses explain how land must be allowed to rest one year out of every seven. People can

eat whatever the land yields during that time, but they may not sow their field or prune their vineyard.

In somewhat similar fashion, the guidelines of the Indiana-Kentucky Synod of the ELCA suggest a seven-year cycle of work and rest. After six years in a congregation, a pastor is eligible for a 12-week time of renewal in addition to her or his other benefits. This time is called a "sabbatical."

After 30 years of ordained ministry without such a thing, 2025 is "the sabbatical year" for Pastors Caroline and Brad; we will be away from Christ the King from June 2 through September 14. During that time, there will be some rest involved; however, thanks to a grant from the Lilly Foundation, we will be doing a fair amount of travel (I'll write more about that later). We'll also focus on our generational roots by digging through three generations of sermons. (I wonder if my grandfather ever preached on Leviticus?!) Finally, at some point in August, we'll deliver our daughter Ellie to the university of her choosing and re-root ourselves for the next phase of life.

In our absence, the people of Christ the King will be well cared for. Worship every Sunday from June 8 through September 7 will be led by a pastor associated with Christ the King. Watch for a rotation between Pastor Steve Schwier, Pastor Tim Diemer, Pastors Gary and Sharon Hilfiger, Pastor Marcus Felde, and Pastor Stacee Fisher Gehring. Pastoral care will be covered by Pastor Steve Schwier (when he's in town) and Pastor Tim Diemer (when Steve is traveling the world too). In May, the CtK staff will put together a good bit of the fall schedule. Any unforeseen issues will be handled by the staff, the church council, and any number of other good-hearted folks. That's what we do around here, after all.

So that you know more about where we'll be and what we'll be doing, I'll write more as the months progress. For now, please mark your calendars for a send-off luncheon on Sunday, June 1, and for a welcome home/Rally Day picnic on Sunday, September 14.

And Christ the King, thank you. Thank you for respecting this age-old concept, for understanding the intent of this time, and for taking this journey with me. I look forward to the unexpected yield that awaits.

Thank you for partnering with us in our mission to support those in need.




New Adult Class: Reading Luke in Context

The gospel of Luke does not stand alone; it is a part of the New Testament, which is part of the larger record of God's action in the world, the Bible. As far as we know, Luke never met Jesus, but he saw Jesus in the ministry of Paul and then researched for himself, talking to many people who had known Jesus. Especially evident is what Luke learned from Mary, the mother of our Lord.

Knowing this background—as well as understanding that Jesus's ministry was conducted in a largely Jewish area controlled by Rome—helps us better read Luke in context. There is a lot left unspoken! Join us on Sunday mornings to learn more.
